

MS/MACAULEY, ALVAN SR.

1908 – 1952
2 Linear Feet

Born in Wheeling, West Virginia on July 17, 1872, Alvan Macauley received his law degree from George Washington University.

He and Estelle C. Littlepage were married in 1895 and they had three children. The collection of his son, Alvan Jr., is also in the Burton Historical Collection

Mr. Macauley joined Packard Motor Car Company in 1910 as general manager. He was appointed vice-president in 1913 and three years later was elected president, still retaining the office of general manager. In 1939 he was elected chairman of the board, which he retained until his retirement in 1948.

Alvan Macauley died in Florida at age 79 on January 16, 1952.

Papers deal mainly with the Packard Company, containing newspaper clippings, publications and correspondence, including personally signed letters from Franklin D. Roosevelt and General John J. Pershing (Box 1:5).
